

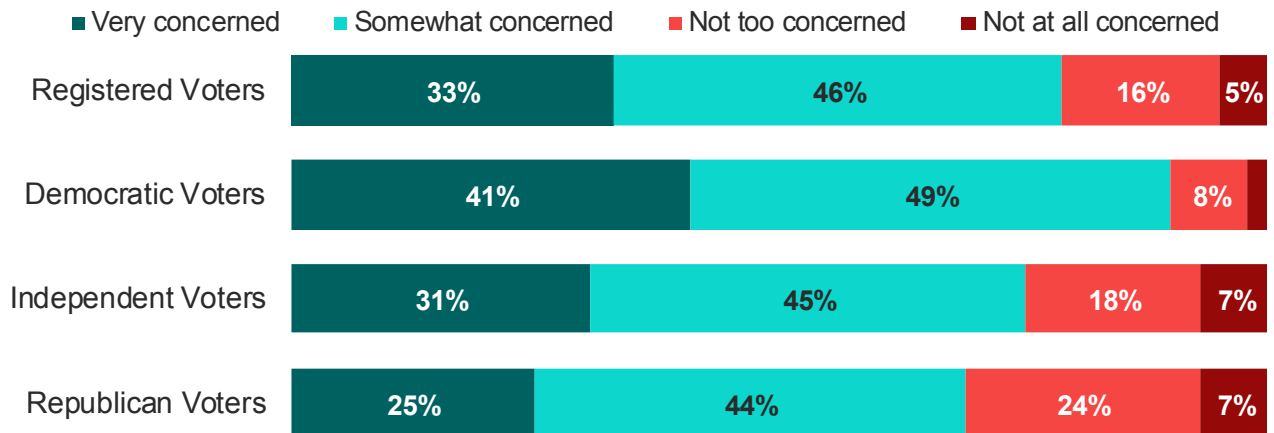

**RE:** Voters' Concern About Legal Challenges to No Surprises Act



**Voters are concerned about lawsuits impacting the *No Surprises Act*.**

- After learning about the *No Surprises Act*, **79% of voters** are concerned that lawsuits from physician and hospital organizations could **delay or overturn the patient protections in the Act**.
  - Concern spans a bipartisan majority of voters: 90% Democratic voters, 76% independent voters, 69% Republican voters.

***Concern That Lawsuits Could Delay or Overturn Patient Protections in the No Surprises Act***



Text provided to respondents: A surprise medical bill occurs when a patient receives care from a doctor or hospital outside of the patient's insurance network. Sometimes the facility or hospital is in-network, but certain doctors and medical specialists are out-of-network and do not accept a patient's insurance. As a result, the doctor or hospital bills the patient for the amount their insurance didn't cover.

Methodology: This poll was conducted between April 15-April 16, 2022 among a sample of 1,985 registered voters. The interviews were conducted online and the data were weighted to approximate a target sample of registered voters based on gender by age, educational attainment, race, marital status, home ownership, race by educational attainment, 2020 presidential vote, and region. Results from the full survey have a margin of error of +/-2%.
