Purpose and Protections of the No Surprises Act

Why Do We Need the No Surprises Act?

- **Millions of Americans** have faced the financial burden and stress of unexpected and unfair surprise medical bills.
- The practice of "balance billing" made it **more difficult** for patients to afford necessary care and even caused bankruptcy for families.
- Through the practice of surprise billing, certain providers were adding **\$40 billion in unnecessary costs** to the health care system.



How is the No Surprises Act Helping Patients?

- In the first **9 months** of implementation, the *No Surprises Act* prevented **9 million bills** from reaching patients and their families.
 - By the end of summer 2023, it is likely that nearly 20 million bills will have been prevented.
- By removing patients from the middle of payment disputes, patients can focus on their top priority their own health rather than the stress of a bill they shouldn't have received.
- By ending balance billing, health care **costs** are being lowered.

Threats to the No Surprises Act

- There are continued threats seeking to undermine the success of the law, despite what the No Surprises Act has done for patients and their families.
- More than 20 lawsuits, including those backed by private-equity groups, seek to change rules and implementing regulations, harming patients in the process.
- If providers are successful, **patients will bear the burden** in the form of higher health care costs.
- It is essential that both Congress and the Biden Administration continue implementing the law as it was written to protect patients.
